The Students of Sleepy Hollow



- Sleepy Hollow Middle School is the home of three grades:
 - 6th Grade
 - 7th Grade
 - 8th Grade
- The school is equipped with several new classrooms, cafeteria, gym, and a state-of-the-art auditorium!

What is the Middle School Like?



- Dedicated faculty committed to the academic, social and personal growth of every child.
- Curriculum designed to engage, enrich and support all students.
- Safe and supportive learning community.
- Extra curricular activities designed to appeal to a wide range of interests and talents.
- Students' schedules will include all of the core classes:
 - English/Language Arts
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Math
- Students' schedules will include a foreign language class. Students have the option of studying Spanish, French, or Italian.

Our School Building



- Middle School students share the same campus as the high school students.
- However, our school building is independent of the High School.
 - Entrance/Exit
 - Cafeteria
 - Playground
 - Gym
 - Lockers
 - Library

Daily Times



Start Time

- Period 1:
 - For students participating in band, chorus, and orchestra
 - 7:45 a.m. start time
- Period 2:
 - First academic period, all students
 - 8:30 a.m. start time

Dismissal

- All students will be dismissed at 3:00 p.m.

Recess



- All grades have separate lunch and recess times.
- Lunch and recess are supervised by the faculty .
- Students are also supervised outside during recess (weather permitting).

Physical Education/Locker Rooms



- Gym is Co-ed, however there are separate boys and girls locker rooms.
- Physical Education teachers will assign each student their own small locker so that they may store their gym clothes/sneakers.
- Large lockers will be assigned by athletic coaches for those students participating in a sport.
- Locker rooms are supervised by school personnel.

School Bus Information

- Buses make two trips in the morning, early and late to accommodate students attending first period.
- Buses also make three trips in the afternoon
 - regular dismissal (3:00)
 - 2 late buses (4:30 & 5:45) to accommodate students staying after school for extra help and/or extra-curricular activities.

Daily Routines



- 6th grade core classes are located on the third floor of the middle school.
- 7th grade core classes are on the second floor.
- 8th grade core classes are on the first floor.
- Middle School cafeteria is located in the new addition of the middle school on the third floor.
- Hallways are routinely and consistently monitored by school personnel at all times.

Daily Routines (cont.)



- Students will leave middle school area for physical education, music, and some foreign language classes.
- Period 2 is “homeroom” – daily attendance is taken at this time.
- All middle school students are placed on one of two teams on each grade level. All students on the same team will have the same teachers.
- Students are encouraged to listen to the morning announcements for daily events and important information.

Honors Classes



- Middle school students have an opportunity to take honors level courses.
- Honors is offered in Math and Science.
- Criteria for placement in Honors:
 - Math/Science
 - Score of 4 on NYS Math exam (Math Honors)
 - Score of 3.5 to 4 on NYS ELA exam and a minimum of 3.5 on NYS Math exam (Science Honors)
 - Placement exam
 - Teacher recommendation

Team Structure



- 2 teams per grade level.
- Students have classes with and participate in activities with fellow team members and team teachers.
- Teachers create interdisciplinary projects & activities that coordinate units of study across disciplines.
- Team field trips and activities.

Guidance and Support Services



- Students are assigned a counselor.
- Counselors support the academic and social growth of all students.
- Counselors work on many adolescent issues such as improving student attendance, bullying prevention, and character education.
- Support services also include reading lab, math lab, after school homework help, and ESL Center.

6th Grade Transition

- Guidance Counselors and 8th grade students will visit all 5th grade classes in June, 2011.
- All 5th grade classes will visit the middle school in May, 2011, meet with teams of teachers and support staff and participate in tours led by 7th grade students.
- Principal's coffee for incoming parents in late August and September to discuss social and emotional concerns related to transitions.
- Counselors will be available prior to the start of the school year to answer any questions or concerns.
- 8th grade peer leaders will assist with the 6th grade orientation process on the first days of school.
- Opening Day will include: a barbeque, school tour, locker assignments, and various team activities.

Middle School Music Department



- Performing Ensembles (period one – 7:45 a.m.)
- Chorus
- Orchestra
 - Concert Orchestra for grades 7 and 8
 - Intermediate Orchestra for grades 6, 7, and 8
 - Junior Orchestra is for 6th grade only – meets after school one day per week
 - Chamber Ensembles – After school one day per week

Middle School Music Department



- Band
 - Concert Band for grades 6, 7, and 8
 - Wind Ensembles for grades 6, 7, and 8
 - Stage Band for grades 6, 7, and 8
- 7th Grade General Music
- 6th Grade General Music

Useful Information



- Agenda Book and Planner
 - On the first day of school each student will receive an agenda book/planner. In the front of the agenda book is a student handbook with all of the school rules and other useful information.
 - The agenda book is the best way to keep track of homework assignments and school responsibilities.

Recognizing Excellence



- All middle school students are recognized quarterly for:
 - High Honor Roll (90+ average)
 - Honor Roll (85-89 average)
 - Student of the Month
 - Citizenship
 - Improvement
 - Perfect Attendance

Honor Roll



- All students are eligible to qualify for honor roll.
- Honor Roll and High Honor Roll are based on the student's Grade Point Average each quarter.
- Honor Roll is achieved with an average of 85-89.
- High Honor Roll is achieved with an average of 90 and above.

Report Cards



- Students in middle school receive a numeric grade based on a 100% scale.
- Report cards are mailed home quarterly.
- Progress reports are mailed home mid-quarter with a Pass/Fail grade and a comment from the teacher.
- Parents may contact the team leader at any time throughout the year to request a team meeting to discuss the progress of their child.


6th Grade Athletics




- As per NYS Athletic Department regulations, 6th grade students are not eligible to participate on modified sports teams.
- Intramural sports program is available to all 6th grade students.
- Intramural sports program will be offered once a week for 45 minutes on the Sleepy Hollow campus.

Middle School Clubs and Activities

- All middle school students are encouraged to participate in all extra-and co-curricular activities offered at Sleepy Hollow Middle School.
- Some clubs that may be offered include:
 - Drama Club and MS Fall Musical and Spring Drama
 - Hollow Herald
 - Strategic Games
 - Math Club
 - Student Council
 - African-American Heritage Club
 - Explorations in Science
