Due July 8

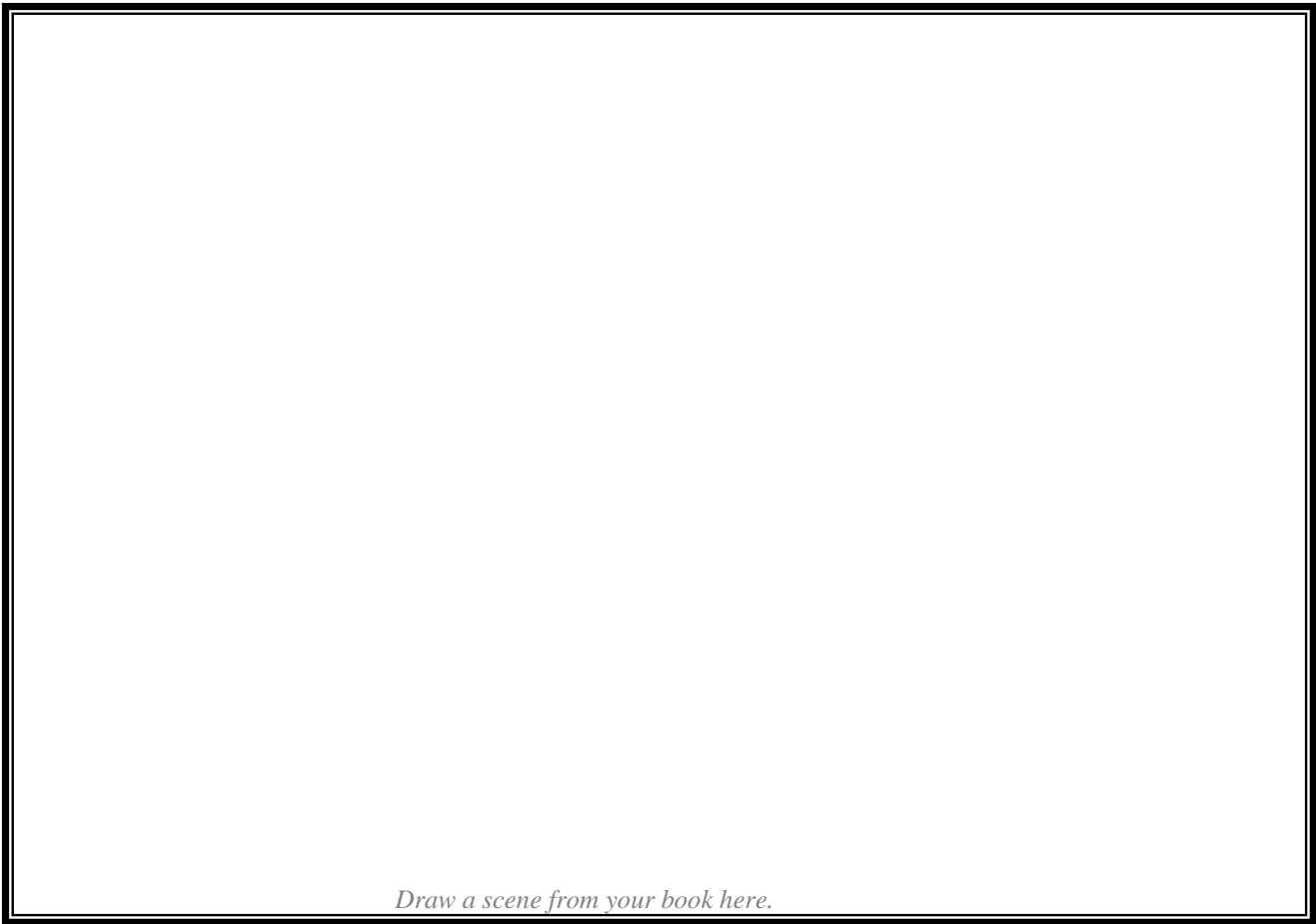

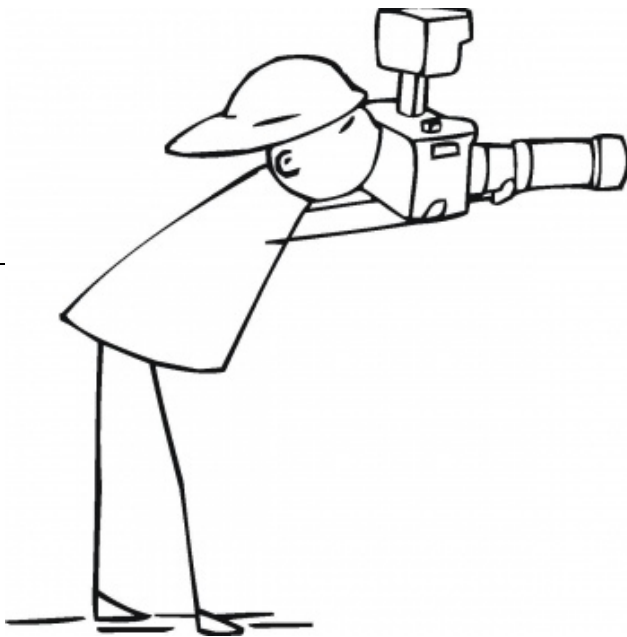




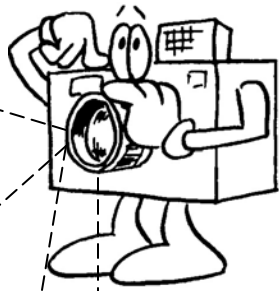
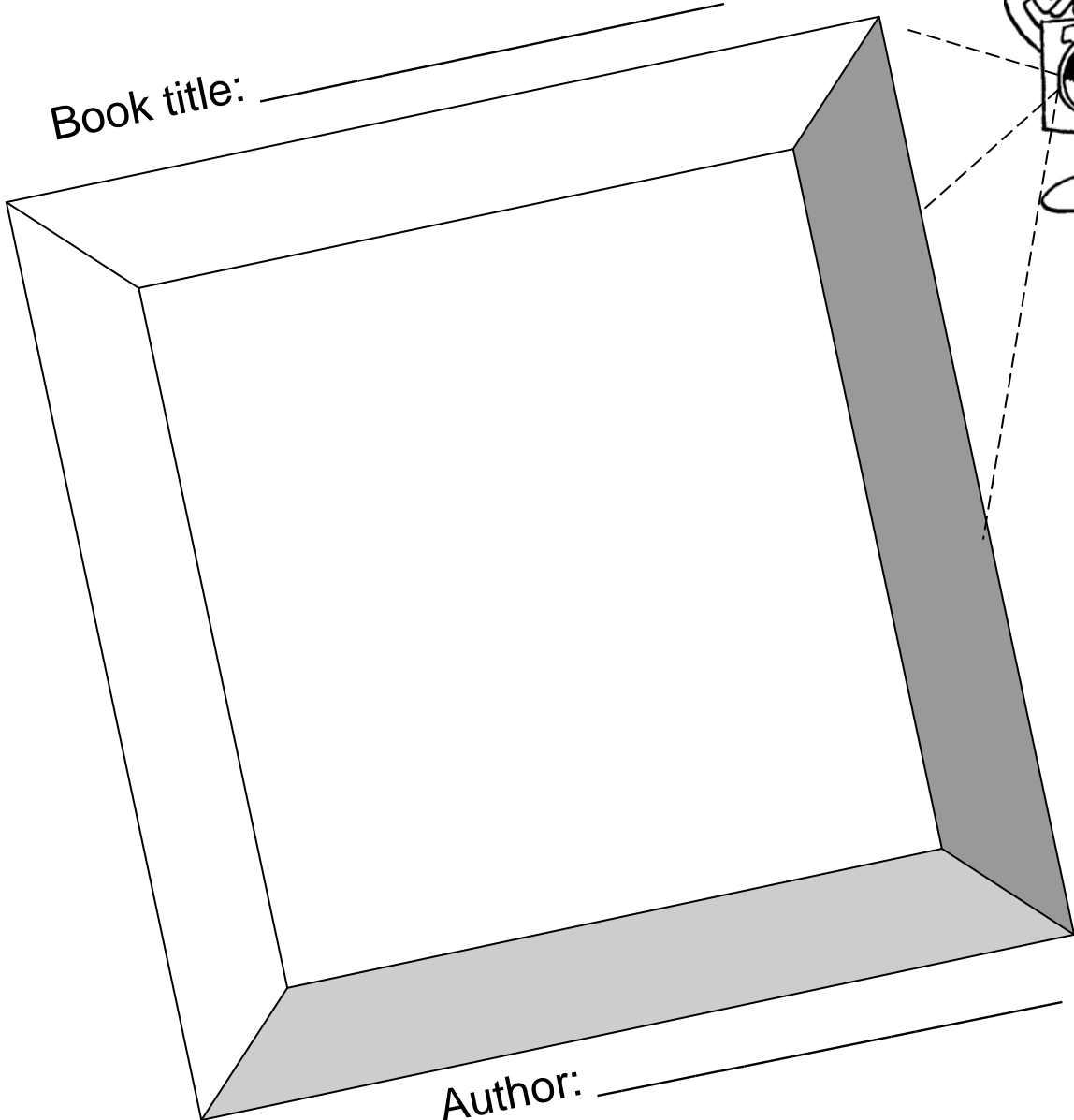
Club Activity #3

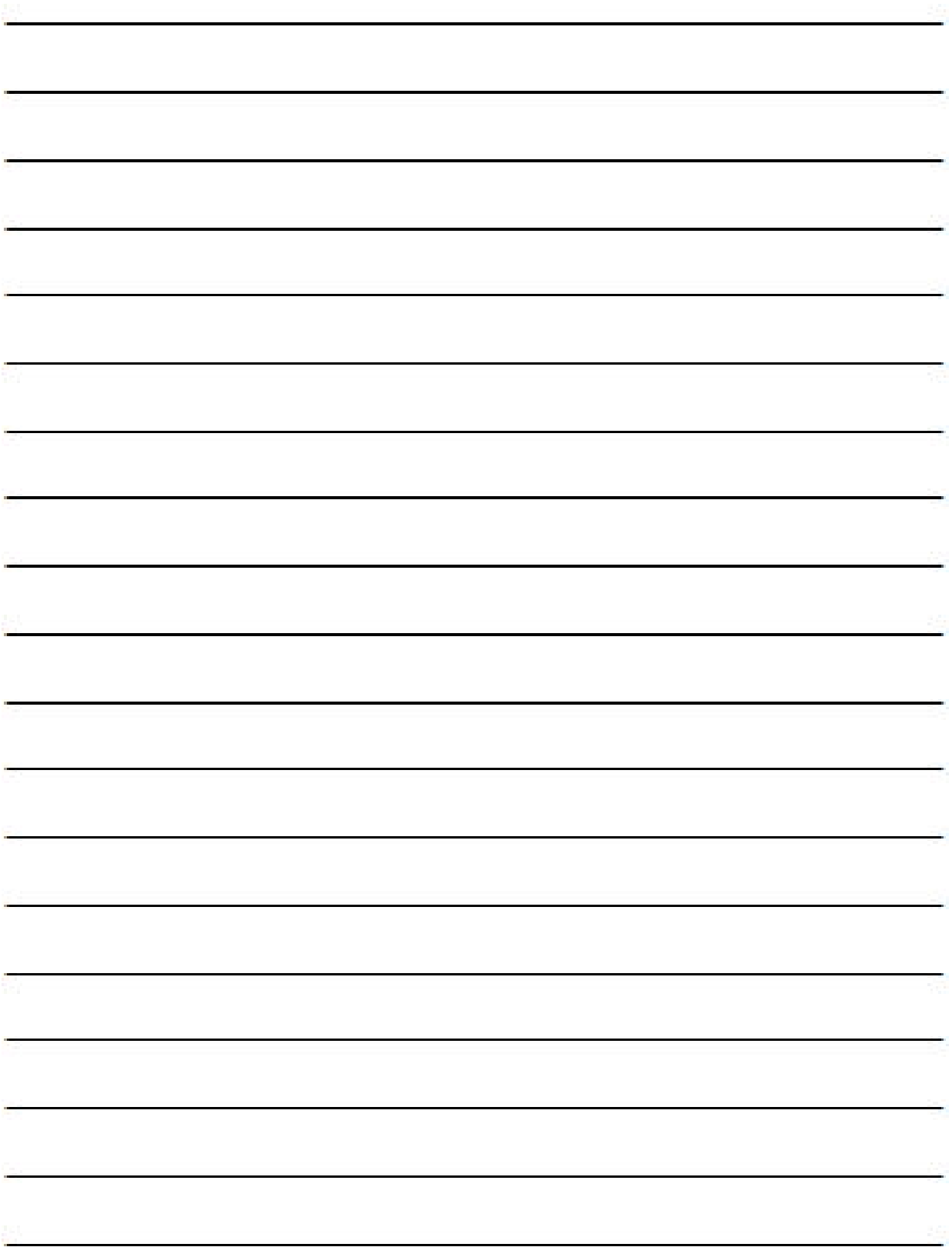

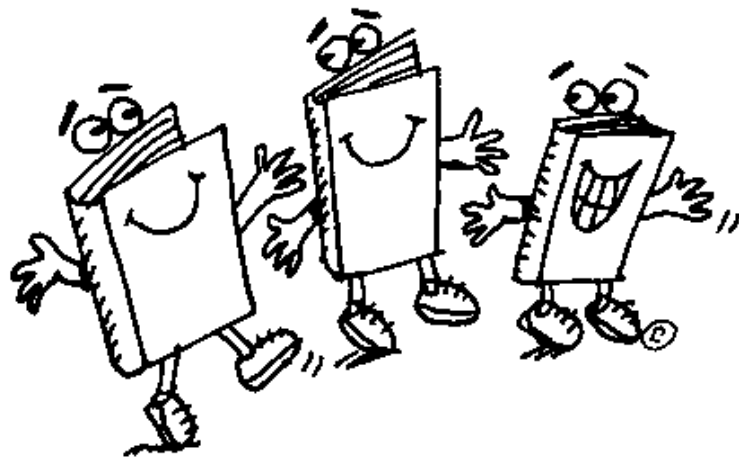


Club Activity #4
