Art Club – Advisor: Ms. Harrison

In a fun social atmosphere, all students will have a hands on chance to explore various formal issues in visual art. The Hudson River in our area is an estuary that contains both salt and fresh water. It is a location that is used by many marine and fresh water organisms as a nursery. Members will help to design a mural or booklet that will communicate the importance of the Hudson River in our daily lives and depict the animals that live there. We will be working with the Hudson River Museum to share what we find out! Field trips to the collection sites at Kingsland and Pearson Park are necessary for collecting.
