The goal of the culinary club is to take a look at the role that food plays in modern civilizations and use it as a medium to address scientific processes and societal issues. Students in the club will gain better understanding of professional culinary techniques, learn about the life cycle of food from production, through harvesting, and then the recycling of materials. Students will also be exposed to budgeting and learn what factors contribute to higher food costs, how to prepare meals on a budget, and where to source the best ingredients. The club will take on a similar theme to the popular television show "chopped" and the students involved will work in teams to learn about ingredients, plan meals, and practice professional techniques that may one day help them secure jobs as professionals in the food industry. Whenever possible, the science behind the practice will be explained and connections to all fields of science (chemistry, biology, ecology, physics, etc.) will be made.
